To Believe

John 20:19-31

Read it first, from your own favorite Bible translation. Then, from "the Message":

¹⁹⁻²⁰ Later on that day, the disciples had gathered together, but, fearful of the Jews, had locked all the doors in the house. Jesus entered, stood among them, and said, "Peace to you." Then he showed them his hands and side.

²⁰⁻²¹ The disciples, seeing the Master with their own eyes, were exuberant. Jesus repeated his greeting: "Peace to you. Just as the Father sent me, I send you."

²²⁻²³ Then he took a deep breath and breathed into them. "Receive the Holy Spirit," he said. "If you forgive someone's sins, they're gone for good. If you don't forgive sins, what are you going to do with them?"

²⁴⁻²⁵ But Thomas, sometimes called the Twin, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. The other disciples told him, "We saw the Master."

But he said, "Unless I see the nail holes in his hands, put my finger in the nail holes, and stick my hand in his side, I won't believe it."

²⁶ Eight days later, his disciples were again in the room. This time Thomas was with them. Jesus came through the locked doors, stood among them, and said, "Peace to you."

²⁷ Then he focused his attention on Thomas. "Take your finger and examine my hands. Take your hand and stick it in my side. Don't be unbelieving. Believe."

²⁸ Thomas said, "My Master! My God!"

²⁹ Jesus said, "So, you believe because you've seen with your own eyes. Even better blessings are in store for those who believe without seeing."

³⁰⁻³¹ Jesus provided far more God-revealing signs than are written down in this book. These are written down so you will believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and in the act of believing, have real and eternal life in the way he personally revealed it.

A MEDITATION

A MESSAGE FROM THE GOSPEL – "I DON'T BELIEVE YOU!" John 20:19-31

This year we celebrated Easter differently than we ever have before. If you think about it, Easter is like no other day. It's a day when faith has to step in, because the resurrection of Jesus Christ is against everything our minds know to be true.

Chapter 20 of John focuses on the empty tomb, and the appearance of the risen Lord Jesus Christ. Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and found the stone rolled away and the tomb empty. She ran to tell Peter and the other disciple that His body wasn't there. They ran to the tomb, and saw it was empty.

Mary stayed at the tomb after Peter and the other disciple returned to where they were staying. (Behind locked doors) She was the first to see Him. She didn't recognize Him until He called her by name. Then she knew. She ran to the others as He instructed her and said, "I have seen the Lord!" I suspect their first reaction was the same as Thomas' reaction. "Yea, Right."

The disciples were back in the room with the locked door on Sunday. But on Sunday night...

Suddenly Jesus was there! "Peace be with you." Had it only been days before when Jesus told them during the last supper, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." Can you imagine standing before the risen Lord and having Him say, "Peace be with you."? Just His presence would have been over powering, but to hear those words and see Him would melt even the coldest heart.

Now we come to Thomas. Poor Thomas. He wasn't there the first time the Lord appeared. The disciples told him about it, but his reaction was like theirs. "I don't believe you." Then he put into words what the rest had probably thought when Mary told them she had seen Jesus. "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." So that was that.

No convincing Thomas, no way, no how. But then a week later...

Jesus was suddenly in the same room behind the same locked doors, and His first words were "Peace be with you." Then He looked at Thomas. Three things come to my mind when I read this story. The presence of Jesus always brings peace. It is the very nature of the risen Lord to bring peace into any situation He is allowed into. The second thing is that Jesus used the same words that Thomas had spoken the week before. Jesus knew what Thomas had said. Does this prove God is omnipresent? It does for me. The 3rd thing is that Jesus didn't rebuke Thomas for his harsh remark about believing only if he could see for himself that it was the Lord. Jesus merely told Thomas that he could prove to himself that it was Jesus by doing what he said would convince him of the resurrection. Once again, Jesus showed the grace of God that carried Him from the cradle to the cross and after His resurrection to those disciples.

So where does that leave us in the 21st century? John summarizes the Book of John this way, "But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." I invite you to read the 20th chapter of John and meditate on what is written.

If questions come to mind while you are meditating on this passage, talk to the Lord. If you would like, I am available to walk through an idea or a question you might have. It would be fun to pray and seek the Lord together for an answer.

May God himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The one who calls you is faithful, and he will do it. (1 Thess 5:23-24)
