# **PSALTER READING**

Psalm 116:1-4, 12-19

I love the Lord, for he heard my voice; he heard my cry for mercy. Because he turned his ear to me, I will call on him as long as I live. The cords of death entangled me, the anguish of the grave came over me; I was overcome by distress and sorrow. Then I called on the name of the Lord: "Lord, save me!" ... What shall I return to the LORD for all his goodness to me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the LORD. I will fulfill my vows to the LORD in the presence of all his people. Precious in the sight of the LORD is the death of his faithful servants. Truly I am your servant, LORD; I serve you just as my mother did; you have freed me from my chains. I will sacrifice a thank offering to you and call on the name of the LORD. I will fulfill my vows to the LORD in the presence of all his people, in the courts of the house of the LORD—in your midst, Jerusalem. Praise the LORD.

GOSPEL Luke 24:13-35

Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. They were talking with each other

about everything that had happened. As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; but they were kept from recognizing him. He asked them, "What are you discussing together as you walk along?" They stood still, their faces downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, "Are you the only one visiting Jerusalem who does not know the things that have happened there in these days?" "What things?" he asked. "About Jesus of Nazareth," they replied. "He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place. In addition, some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning but didn't find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but they did not see Jesus."

He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself. As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus continued on as if he were going farther. But they urged him strongly, "Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over." So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. They asked each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?" They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.

# **SERMON**

"What to do in the in-between?"

Luke 24:13-35

We know what to do in the beginning. We are pretty good about knowing what to do in the end. But what about the in-between?

Jesus had just been crucified. Our hopes gone up in smoke. Now what? He told us that he would rise from the dead, but could he not just as well been kept from the cross in the first place? After all, he was the anointed one, the only begotten of the Father. When Jesus was crucified, so were our hopes. He died, our hopes followed. And when he was buried, our hope was buried with him.

In the beginning, we welcomed him. In the end we buried him. Now, in the in-between what do we do? In-between his death and his promise ... We go in the opposite direction of our initial hopes. What else are we to do?

Lo and behold if we do not meet a stranger who asks us a most impertinent question, "What's going on?" What! Do you not know? Are you the only one left out in the dark? Did you just arrived on the scene? Well, since you asked, Jesus our Hope and Messiah has just been crucified. He died and he has been buried. That's what's "Going on!"

Now, the stranger takes these disciples to town and answers his own question. He lets them in on "What's really going on." Resurrection! Hope renewed. No, Hope made alive for evermore. Hope never to die again. The stranger starts to let them in on what's really going on. What is going on is the fulfillment of God's promises. He, our hope will live forever more. Our sins, all of them, moved out of the way. No longer a barrier between God and us. Surely our hearts burn as we hear the resurrected Christ speak to us. Confidently we recognize him in the breaking of the bread. The metaphor and the reality coming together in one. The bread that came down from heaven broken for us now breaks the bread before us. It is him! Jesus is alive! Let's go tell....
