SERMON

"Stories" Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23 Carlos Baladez

Stories come in many forms. They have different purposes. They entertain, inform or persuade. Think of your childhood stories. The Three Little Pigs. Goldilocks and the Three Bears. Jack and the Bean Stalk. Or How about Aesop's Fables? Always

with a moral to learn. Can you recall a family story? Perhaps it was one where you moved frequently. Maybe one of your grandfather's or grandmother's "back in the day" stories. How about your favorite pet? We also have the more personal stories. Our first kiss. Our first puppy love and first heart break.

Yes, stories are wonderful. It is how we store and recall our memories. They are full of adventure, colors, scents, feelings, and imagination.

Now here in this text we have Jesus teaching the multitude. And what does he use? A story. How best does God in the flesh convey spiritual truths to humans? Through a means they are familiar with: a story.

Let's read Matthew 13:1-9 and then skip to verses 18-23.

That same day Jesus left the house and went out beside Lake Galilee, where he sat down to teach. Such large crowds gathered around him that he had to sit in a boat, while the people stood on the shore. Then he taught them many things by using stories. He said: A farmer went out to scatter seed in a field. While the farmer was scattering the seed, some of it fell along the road and was eaten by birds. Other seeds fell on thin, rocky ground and quickly started growing because the soil wasn't very deep. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched and dried up, because they did not have enough roots. Some other seeds fell where thornbushes grew up and choked the plants. But a few seeds did fall on good ground where the plants produced a hundred or sixty or thirty times as much as was scattered. If you have ears, pay attention!

Now listen to the meaning of the story:

The seeds that fell along the road are the people who hear the message about the kingdom, but don't understand it. Then the evil one comes and snatches the message from their hearts. The seeds that fell on rocky ground are the people who gladly hear the message and accept it right away. But they don't have deep roots, and they don't last very long. As soon as life gets hard or the message gets them in trouble, they give up. The seeds that fell among the thornbushes are also people who hear the message. But they start worrying about the needs of this life and are fooled by the desire to get rich. So the message gets choked out, and they never produce anything. The seeds that fell on good ground are the people who hear and understand the message. They produce as much as a hundred or sixty or thirty times what was planted.

Did you recognize an old familiar pattern? Three little pigs. Three bears. Three unproductive grounds. Jesus, God Incarnate telling stories to get a spiritual truth

across to his audience. The seed remains the same. The difference was the ground which received it. The first ground was hard. The second was shallow. While the third was crowded. Now in place of ground, read heart. The first heart was hard. The second heart was shallow. The third heart was crowded. But the forth heart was just right! It was cultivated. The fallow ground was broken up. The soil was toiled and tilled. The soil was also cleared of debris.

We are called to prepare our hearts to receive the Life giving Word of God. Humbling ourselves before God, softens our hard hearts. Casting all our care upon him gives us deep focus. Renouncing the glitter of this world rids us of distractions.

Let us give up the old and make room for the new. May we forsake the temporary to embrace the eternal. May God in his grace lead us to abandon the lie and the lies and receive the TRUTH that makes truly us free. Fulfilled. Satisfied! Enjoying his fellowship forever and bringing him glory in the process.

Finally, with our eyes and hearts are clean, we are ready to receive the eternal seed and produce in abundance, 30, 60, and 100 fold.

Wow! All this truth hidden in a story. A story told us by the creator of the universe. Our creator. Our Lord and Savior. We can trust His-Story!

To God alone be all the glory. Amen.
