1 Corinthians 11:23-26

For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in

remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. (NIV)

First, read the text two or three times. Let the words sink in. Savor them. Allow yourself to feel them. Ask the Holy Spirit to make you alive to the text. Then, answer the following questions:

Why Bread?

How is this his body?

How do I remember Jesus in this meal?

Why fruit of the Vine?

What does this new covenant contain?

When and where am I proclaiming the Lord's death until he comes?

Feast on the Word, now and forever. Amen

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY
