NEW TESTAMENT READINGPhilippians 4:1-9GOSPEL READINGMatthew 22:1-14

Jesus starts the parable in Matthew with, "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to..." It seems the whole thing goes downhill from there. The king mentioned, seems kind of stern. Those that were invited to the wedding feast weren't much better. They even killed some of the king's slaves. An enraged king then sent his army to destroy the murderers and burn their town down. Is this really what the kingdom of heaven may be compared to?

What happened to mercy and grace? Isn't that important and overriding?

I told someone this week that the sermon was on Mercy, Grace and Responsibilities and he asked what about God's responsibility? He created mankind the way we are and knew that we would mess up. Does He accept responsibility for that? God created all of us and gives us the privilege to respond to His love anyway we want. He hopes we will respond to His love with love both for Him and for our fellow human beings. To give us the ability to do that He sent His only Begotten Son to die on the cross for us. It did not end there. He then sends His Holy Spirit to dwell in us and be with us so we can have the ability to live the lives He created us for. I believe that God did accept His responsibilities to us.

Let us look at the Old Testament law. The prophets told us of different parts of the law. Amos – Act justly (Amos 5:24)

Hosea – love mercy (Hosea 6:6)

Isaiah – walk humbly with your God (Isaiah 29:19)

Micah formulated these into a single scripture - Micah 6:8

He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you?

To do justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

When you look at Micah 6:8, for me, the first thing that stands out is the fact that these actions are done from the heart. They start internally. They come from a heart that has been given to God. The Jewish sacrifices were actions that didn't need a heart turned to God. To offer a lamb or a dove at the temple could have just been something people knew they had to do. It was the law, and most of the time it was treated that way. What God wants is a heart turned over to Him so He can love others through that heart.

The word "Responsibilities" may be the wrong word to use in the sermon title. Responsibilities implies "yet something else I have to do." It sounds more like the LAW. Maybe the word "assignments" would be better. In school, you could do an assignment or not, but you had the choice. Of course, not doing an assignment didn't help your grade, but you were free to do as you please.

There are 66 books in the Bible. 27 in the New Testament, 39 in the old. Depending on the size of the print, there is a large number of pages with God's laws written on them. But Jesus condensed those laws down 2 commands - Love God, and love your neighbor. By the power and work of the Holy Spirit in our lives, we can begin to do exactly what God has asked of us. In loving God and our neighbor, we can do justly, love mercy and walk humbly with our God.
