SERMON

"Always Thankful" 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

"Thank you," is one of the earliest words our parents taught us to say. The others were, "please, I love you, and I'm sorry." The famous motivational speaker, Zig Ziegler, is known to say, "Your attitude determines your altitude." Thankfulness is also tied to good health. Scientists agree with scripture when they say, "gratitude is healthy for your heart."

Here, in today's scripture, Paul blesses its recipients with grace and peace from the Source of all good things, the Father and his son Jesus Christ. He then proceeds to give thanks. He gives thanks for what is Given, for who is Enriched, and for what it does - Sustains.

Paul lives in this attitude of gratitude. He always thanks his God. He thanks his God for his recipients and for a specific reason. Because of the grace given them in Christ Jesus. This grace of God is found in a specific person, in Jesus Christ. This grace did something in the recipients. It enriched them. It enriched them in every way. It enriched them in every way with all kinds of speech and with all knowledge. In this way, God confirmed that Christ was indeed among them. Jesus had previously told his disciples, "I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you," and he did, on the day of his resurrection. Fifty days later, the Spirit of truth came to them on the day of Pentecost.

These Corinthian believers did not lack any spiritual gifts. I will only mention a few here, but I encourage you to look at a more comprehensive lists of these gifts. You may want to consult the following scriptures asking the Holy Spirit to reveal to you his gifting to you. In 1st Corinthians Paul mentions the following: Word of wisdom, Word of knowledge, Faith, Gifts of healings, Miracles, Prophecy, Distinguishing between spirits, Tongues, and Interpretation of tongues. In Romans 12:6-8 Paul mentions these: Prophecy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Giving, Leadership, and Mercy. For a fuller list please see 1st Corinthians 12:28-30, Ephesians 4:11, and 1 Peter 4:11.

We are quite familiar with 1 Corinthians 14:40, "Let all things be done decently and in order." Let us too be as familiar with the preceding verse, 14:39 which states, "Wherefore, brethren, covet to prophesy, and forbid not to speak with tongues." Why? May I suggest, because prophesy builds up the body while tongues builds up the inner man as it speaks mysteries with our heavenly Father.

These gifts of grace are not lacking in these Corinthians as they wait eagerly for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed.

Paul's thankfulness is also given to God because God will keep his people firm to the end and they will be found blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Yes, thankfully and confidently so because God is faithful who has called them and us into fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Therefore, let us too thank God and fly high with an attitude of gratitude. Let us thank God for the grace we have been given in Christ Jesus, because we have been enriched in Christ Jesus, and because in Jesus Christ Almighty God sustains us.

To God alone be all the Glory, Amen.
