SERMON "I Love the Lord" Larry Sears

Sermon: I love the Lord

In the Old Testament lesson today from Isaiah we read a prophecy about what Jesus will go through just before He is led up the hill to Golgotha. His beard will be pulled out. He will be beaten, mocked and spat upon. Then the passage says, "I will not be disgraced. I will not be put to shame." I think I'm missing something. To me, everything mentioned that will happen to the Lord shouts shame and disgrace, so how can Isaiah write. "I will not be disgraced. I will not be put to shame?" It appears to be one of those "contradictions" that some people say make the Bible irrelevant.

I believe that the Bible is the inspired written Word of God just as Jesus is the living Word of God. There must be a different way to understand this passage than through my human understanding. In Isaiah 43:1 Isaiah writes, "But now thus says the Lord who created you, O Jacob, and He that formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by your name; you are Mine." Remember when Jesus was baptized? A voice from heaven

said, "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased." The Jewish leaders saw Jesus as a threat. He was a threat to their way of life, a threat to the peace that Israel had attained under the Roman rule. They needed to take care of the threat. They would do that by the worst form of death that has been devised - crucifixion.

The Sanhedrin and the leadership of Israel would have labeled Jesus a fraud, a threat, and a law breaker. They were more interested in when He performed a miracle, rather than in what the result. When He healed on the Sabbath they criticized Him for "working on the Sabbath." In Matthew 11, they said, "Behold a man gluttonous, and a winebibber, a friend of publicans and sinners." The leaders used human derogatory names for the One that God called His Son. They only looked at Him with human understanding. Humankind has a way of accepting the names we use to define people. The names or labels we are saddled with include; nationality, skin color, gender, education, employment, financial status, and relationships - all those things that we can use to separate ourselves from those who are different from us.

When I was in middle school I was placed in a remedial reading class. I understood what I was reading, but I was treated as if I was slow and unable to learn at the pace of the other students. I listened to what others said about me and began to believe the label. A short time later, one of my teachers told my mom, I was in the wrong class. She suggested that I have my eyes tested. I received my first pair of glasses in the 6th grade. My mom told me she was so sorry about my eyes. She worked in a doctor's office that was a block away from our house so I visited regularly. We walked by the eye chart several times a week, but she never thought to test my eyes. I remember as we drove home from getting my glasses I was amazed that I could see the individual leaves on the trees and said so. My mom said she almost pulled over and cried because she didn't realize that my eye sight was so poor. I was labeled one way in the school system.

But God...

Somewhere along the line, a teacher noticed something that said the label was wrong. God is like that. We have our labels, but God says otherwise. Man called Jesus names so they could fit Him into their thinking. God called Jesus His Son, and said He loved Him. Which name do you think was the truth?

That is basically the same question that Jesus asked the disciples, "Who do you say I am?" Peter answered truthfully because he had gotten to know Jesus as he followed Him and rather than listening to the labels people who didn't know Jesus used, Peter believed the labels that Jesus used.

What labels have you allowed to mold you? Listen to what God says about you:

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. And God saw everything that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. (Gen. 1)

"I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness. (Jeremiah 31:3)

You are redeemed through His blood. (Ephesians 1:7)

For you are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. (Eph.2:10)

You have become a child of God. (John 1:12)

Let us be molded into the people that God has called us to be. Believe what He says about you.

You are loved.

You are redeemed.

You are drawn to God through the power of the Holy Spirit.

You are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do god works.

You are a child of God.

And when God created you, He said you were very good!

Because of all of these things you can truthfully say, "I love the Lord."

Walk in the way the Lord is leading you. Bring praise, honor, and glory to Him in all you say and do.

Amen.
