SERMON "The Books Were Opened" Larry Sears

In the Old Testament lesson Daniel writes, ⁹ "As I looked, "thrones were set in place, and the Ancient of Days took his seat. His clothing was as white as snow; the hair of his head was white like wool. His throne was flaming with fire, and its wheels were all ablaze. ¹⁰ A river of fire was flowing, coming out from before him. Thousands upon thousands attended him; ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. The court was seated, and the books were opened."

The books were opened... Though the names of the books aren't mentioned, it is quite possible that they will include the Books of Remembrance and the Book of Life. In the Old Testament,

after every king of Israel and Judah died, it is written, "The other events of his reign and all his ways, from beginning to end, are written in the book of the kings of Judah and Israel." These would be books of remembrance.

In ancient times kings kept books of deeds done by people in their kingdoms. It allowed them to reward those whose service helped the kingdom. It doesn't mean that those people were rewarded immediately, but they might be rewarded eventually. One such incident involving a book of remembrance is in the 6th chapter of Esther.

That night the king could not sleep; so he ordered the book of the chronicles, the record of his reign, to be brought in and read to him. ² It was found recorded there that Mordecai had exposed Bigthana and Teresh, two of the king's officers who guarded the doorway, who had conspired to assassinate King Xerxes. ³ "What honor and recognition has Mordecai received for this?" the king asked. "Nothing has been done for him," his attendants answered. King Xerxes proceeded to reward Mordecai for his service.

Another time a book of remembrance is mentioned is in Malachi 3 verses 16-18:

"Then those who feared the LORD spoke to one another, and the LORD gave attention and heard it, and a book of remembrance was written before Him for those who fear the LORD and who esteem His name. 'They will be Mine,' says the LORD of hosts, 'on the day that I prepare My own possession, and I will spare them as a man spares his own son who serves him. So, you will again distinguish between the righteous and the wicked, between one who serves God and one who does not serve Him"

Why do I mention all this? I believe that starting in July of 1923, books of remembrance were begun for Crestholme Presbyterian Church. According to your own history on the website, Crestholme Presbyterian Church was organized in November 1923 with twenty members, two Elders, and one Deacon. The Rev. J. W. Harrison was the first pastor. Preceding organization a Sunday school was formed in July 1923 under the direction of Rev. J. L. McMurray.

Over the years your names were added to the book, your conversations are there, your ministries to the Body of Christ, and to the neighborhood are there for all in heaven to see. This is just speculation, but perhaps the saints who are gone are able to read of your exploits. In the last 4 years, my name and Carlos' name has been added to the book of remembrance for Crestholme. It shows Fred is ministering to you during the month. Rev. Heger was added as a minister to the saints at Crestholme.

I want you to think about something for a moment. Look around. I know you don't see a lot of people here today. I have heard stories of "lots of people" attending Crestholme. While you are looking around, realize that you have more people here today than there were 98 years ago when the church was formed.

I know that December will be my last month of ministering to you as I have been. Even when I'm not here to minister from the pulpit, my prayers for you will still be entered into the book of remembrance as I lift you up to the Lord. I want to give you something to encourage you. I believe the books of remembrance were used to write the letters to the churches in the Book of Revelation. So here is my letter to Crestholme Presbyterian Church.

To the saints at Crestholme:

Though you look around and see fewer people than you have had in the past, your perseverance, works, love, and hope are greater today than they have ever been. You see an old church. I see a church that is only a child. After all, the Ancient of Days has been working with you, encouraging you, and loving you since before the world was formed.

He knows your deeds, your love and faith, your service and perseverance, and that you are now doing more than you did at first. Look back on the things that have been done, not with longing for the "good old days" but to see how God has been walking with you throughout the life of Crestholme. Use the knowledge that the saints, who are no longer with us have passed on to you.

And lest you become proud of your accomplishments, remember all that has been done through you was done by the love of God, in the power of the Holy Spirit, and by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and through the prayers of those who love you, and want to see you blessed by God.

May the book of remembrance show that you act justly, you love mercy, and you walk humbly before our God.
