SERMON**"Adonai, Lord"
Deuteronomy 10:17****Dr. Carlos Baladez**

"For the LORD your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who shows no partiality and accepts no bribes."

Throughout history, one can see the trail of tears left behind in the wake of the atrocities committed by the image-bearers of God when they wrongfully assume titles, verbs, nouns, and adjectives belonging solely to God. When these men and women usurp what rightfully belongs to God alone, we witness wars, pillaging, rapes, murders, robbing, slavery, torture, and savagery.

Words are invented to justify such behaviors. Words like "they," "them," "am I my brother's keeper," "raca," "alternative truths," and derogatory terms referring to Haiti, El Salvador, and African countries. All these words and behaviors are justified under the umbrella term "enemies," to justify "collateral damage," making nationalistic führer or furor acceptable.

These sub-reptilian results are the zenith of our hubris in wanting to become like God.

Samuel warned the people of God this would happen when they clamored for a king like the other nations. Samuel said, "This is what the king who will reign over you will claim as his rights: **He will take** your sons and make them serve with his chariots and horses, and they will run in front of his chariots. Some he will assign to be commanders of thousands and commanders of fifties, and others to plow his ground and reap his harvest, and still others to make weapons of war and equipment for his chariots. **He will take** your daughters to be perfumers and cooks and bakers. **He will take** the best of your fields and vineyards and olive groves and give them to his attendants. **He will take** a tenth of your grain and of your vintage and give it to his officials and attendants. Your menservants and maidservants and the best of your cattle and donkeys **he will take** for his own use. **He will take** a tenth of your flocks, and you yourselves will become his slaves. When that day comes, you will cry out for relief from the king you have chosen, and the LORD will not answer you in that day." But the people refused to listen to Samuel. "No!" they said. "We want a king over us. Then we will be like all the other nations, with a king to lead us and to go out before us and fight our battles." (1 Sam. 8:11-20, NIV) Did you notice the recurrent theme of, "**he will take?**" This has been our human -experience – take, take, take, take - as we continue to clamor for a human master, lord and king instead of God.

Why mention all this darkness when we are on a journey to know God by name? To show a contrast between the false wearers of titles like lord, master, and ruler. You see, the name of God we are observing today is Adonai meaning Lord, Master, Ruler. Within the USA context, the Old Antebellum South usurped the term "master," and left a sullied stain on this term.

Yet, by looking to its rightful owner we can redeem it and see that it fits God perfectly. Yes, "master" is worthy only of ONE, our loving creator. In the historical cases mention above the relationship and expectations between the two parties were what the slave or servant could do for his/her master. In the case of our relationship with God as our master, the relationship and its expectations are inverted. In this godly and righteous relationship, it is what God, as master, does for us enslaved by sin.

Turning to the Psalmist and to Isaiah for insight, instruction, redemption, and restoration of this term and image - to its rightful owner - we see God, the Master/Ruler/King over all living and created things (which includes you and me). In looking to Adonai, we view each other no longer as "you," against "me" or "us," against "them" but as "we," and "us," together as one under one lordship and Lord. Adonai is master/ruler of us all.

And as master/ruler Adonai advocates for and blesses (makes happy) creation. Adonai gives his best to his image-bearers. Adonai loosens our bonds, bears our daily burdens, is good to us and forgives us. He is merciful and gracious to us, in love and faithfulness he acts towards us. He gives us strength, accomplishes for us, is our helper and upholds us. And he makes us glad to boot!*

Crestholme, behold Adonai! Our Master/Lord//Ruler/and King. There is no other One.

To God be the glory, honor, power and praise now and forever, amen.
