SERMON "Yaweh Rophey-The Lord Our Healer" Dr. Carlos Baladez Exodus 15:26

He said, "If you listen carefully to the LORD your God and do what is right in his eyes, if you pay attention to his commands and keep all his decrees, I will not bring on you any of the diseases I brought on the Egyptians, for I am the LORD, who heals you." (NIV)

I want you to close your eyes and feel this next word. Sense it. Touch it and allow it to touch you. God. Think it. Meditate on it. Contemplate it. Let it not only fill your mind but your heart and soul as well. Keep that word in your mind and feel it in your heart. Feel the power in that word. Sense the enormity of it. Experience its majesty, who it represents, and all that it encompasses. Yes, God. Now open your eyes. I hope you gave yourself permission and the time and space to encounter your creator within that word, God. The Creator of the cosmos with its galaxies, stars, suns, planets, moons, plants, animals, and you are God's. Your God. Your, loving, adoring, and faithful God.

The Israelites had experienced 400 years in Egypt bearing the yoke of Pharaoh. They were the "minorities," while the Egyptians were the privileged and dominant culture. Before Moses came on the scene, after having an encounter with God at the burning bush that burned but would not be consumed by the fire, the Israelites were slaves to Pharaoh and his kingdom. Under Egyptian rule, the Israelites were subject to their taskmasters' will and whim.

Yet, the day came when God heard their cry and sent Moses and Aaron to deliver a basic message to Pharaoh on behalf of God: Let my people go!

Pharaoh, in his arrogant prime, pride, and hubris said, "And who is God?" Underlying tone, "we have our own gods."

Well then, God puts on the ritz. God, through Moses and Aaron, sends Pharaoh ten messages. These messages were encoded in words and shortly after these words were delivered, the manifestations were seen. They were incarnated if you will. Exodus 7:14-

18 states, "Then the Lord said to Moses, "Pharaoh's heart is unyielding; he refuses to let the people go. Go to Pharaoh in the morning as he goes out to the river. Confront him on the bank of the Nile, and take in your hand the staff that was changed into a snake. Then say to him, 'The Lord, the God of the Hebrews, has sent me to say to you: Let my people go, so that they may worship me in the wilderness. But until now you have not listened. This is what the Lord says: By this you will know that I am the Lord: With the staff that is in my hand I will strike the water of the Nile, and it will be changed into blood. The fish in the Nile will die, and the river will stink; the Egyptians will not be able to drink its water." And so it happened, just as it had been spoken.

Since Pharaoh continued in his stubbornness, the other nine messages followed; frogs, lice, flies, livestock pestilence, boils, hail, locusts, darkness, and finally, the one that broke the camel's back, the killing of each firstborn; both of human and cattle.

Under the heavy hand of God, Pharaoh relented and finally released the Israelites and they, the children of God, were freed to go and worship God as a liberated nation.

The Israelites had been witness to all these plagues and had seen how the health and welfare of the Egyptians were affected. The Israelites left Egypt, but not before they had plundered the Egyptians as God instructed them to do. The Egyptians were more than glad to turn over the loot and rid themselves of the Israelites, lest God kill them all.

As they left Egypt, Pharaoh reversed his decision and pursued them. God put a final stop to the chase at the Red Sea. God parted the waters for his people and closed the sea upon their enemies.

Moses sings his song and Miriam dances her dance. And then the first test from the Lord comes. "Then Moses led Israel from the Red Sea and they went into the Desert of Shur. For **three** days they traveled in the desert without finding water. When they came to Marah, they could not drink its water because it was bitter. (That is why the place is called Marah). So the people grumbled against Moses, saying, "What are we to drink?" Then Moses cried out to the Lord, and the Lord showed him a piece of wood. He threw it into the water, and the water became fit to drink. There the Lord issued a ruling and instruction for them and put them to the test. He said, "If you **listen** carefully to the Lord your God **and do** what is right in his eyes, if you **pay attention** to his commands **and keep** all his decrees, I will not bring on you any of the diseases I brought on the Egyptians, for **I am the Lord, who heals you**." (I.e. who protects you and keeps these diseases off of you)

It was within this context that we find today's verse.

They are now free from bondage and out in the wilderness.

We've all been in this desert, metaphorically. We too have spent our three days in this wilderness. The waters there are bitter. Perhaps we too have asked, "Did God deliver us only to let us die? Is this our punishment for being enslaved to sin?"

Surely not! He delivered us to worship him. To love and know him. We have seen his great hand of deliverance. We too have plundered the Egyptians of our lives. As the Israelites saw the judgment of God on the gods of the Egyptians reducing them to nothing and revealing them as false, we too have seen this same God do the same to the false gods in our lives.

Yes, our God is not only able to free us, and he has, he is also able to feed us. To quench our thirst and make our bitter waters drinkable by the wood of the Cross of Jesus and lead us to Elim, the place of abundant sweet water.

Let us call out to our God and allow him to continue proving himself as the One True God who is able to do whatever the occasion calls for to meet our needs. Our God loves and values us. Because of his love for us, we willing and lovingly reciprocate his love for him. This love creates an immense love and gratitude for him and gives birth to loving and willing obedience flowing from our hearts. He is the one who knits us to wholeness because he IS our healer. He stitches us back together into whole and complete units. His initial blessing in Genesis is restored and in Christ is expanded.

Dear God, we turn to you this morning. We look up to you and see you by faith and look within us and receive your loving and gracious touch by your faith. You have placed the faith of Jesus within us by grace, love, and mercy.

You Lord Jesus are our hope. In you, we have been forgiven.

Friends, we no longer have to live in bondage to sin. At Calvary's Cross guilt, sin, shame, doubt, fear, and unbelief were dealt with and removed. Therefore, let us declare that we have been forgiven, accepted, cleansed, received back home, and restored to new glory in Christ Jesus. A home full of forgiveness. A home to a new life in Christ Jesus for evermore. The doors home have been open tall and wide for the King of Glory to walk in carrying us on the coattails of his glory, the train of his garments that fills the temple. In Christ Jesus, we revere the name of God. Therefore, the sun of righteousness will rise with healing in its rays and we will go out and frolic like well-fed calves.

Come, Lord, we invite you to once again put on your ritz and manifest your victory over our internal and external enemies, diseases, and the like. We, by grace and love, give you glory, honor, and praise now and forever. Alleluia! Amen!
