SERMON

**"Or Olam, Everlasting Light"
Isaiah 60:19**

"The sun will no more be your light by day, nor will the brightness of the moon shine on you, for the Lord will be your everlasting light, and your God will be your glory."

Light is a wonderful sight. It is mysterious. Subject it to one set of experiments and the results indicate that light is made up of particles. Subject it to a different set of experiments and the results show that light is made up of waves. In a way it reflects the mysterious name of God in Genesis 1:1. "In the beginning, God made the heavens and the earth." Here, the name of God in the original language is Elohim. A plural ending on a singular pronoun, El. God is not explained, Elohim is only introduced. God is not understood but can be experienced. His name is beyond our full comprehension yet we can experience Elohim in all of our humanity. Mystery 101.

Light is also a theme that runs across scripture from Genesis through Revelation. In Genesis 1:3, we have, "And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light." (NIV) While, in Revelation 22:5 we have, "There will be no more night. They will not need the light of a lamp or the light of the sun, for the Lord God will give them light. And they will reign forever and ever." (NIV). And in the gospel of John, speaking of Jesus, John writes, "In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." (NIV)

In scripture, light is often contrasted with darkness. Metaphors about light abound in scripture. Their main purpose is to give us hints or insights into spiritual lessons which are couched in natural or physical terms. We have such metaphors in our English language such as, "She is a ray of sunshine." or "She lit up the room with her presence." Or "I was given the green light." It is obvious the person is not physically light. But metaphors are communication tools used to help illustrate or explain something by comparing it to something else.

Someone once defined darkness not by what it is but by what it is not. The definition was, "darkness is the absence of light." It has been said that darkness exists while the light does not show up.

In the Old Testament, we are presented with the Tabernacle of Moses in the wilderness. We see the Outer Court, the Inner Court, and the Holy of Holies. The Outer Court was illuminated by the sun above. The Inner Court was illuminated by the light coming from the burning Menorah, while the Holy of Holies was illuminated by the very presence of God manifested, the Shekinah Glory. One light illuminates our physical world, another illuminates our minds, while yet another one illuminates our spirits.

Every 24-hour day, our Earth experiences light in one hemisphere while at the same time the other half experiences darkness. Scripture often describes the acts of humankind in these terms. Sins, transgressions, and iniquities are often performed

under the cover of darkness while acts of love, joy, peace, and truth are performed in the light.

It does not take one a long time after watching the evening news, picking up a newspaper, or scanning one's phone to see all sorts of violent acts. What adult American does not know what 911, Uvalde, or Columbine mean? The same is true when one mentions Ukraine, Hiroshima, or the Holocaust. Terms never heard before also witness another picture of darkness; Co-Vid, Ebola, Monkey Pox.

Yet, in the midst of all the darkness which surrounds, God, our God, Or Olam- God of Everlasting Light gives us the light of hope. Notice the context in which the name of Or Olam occurs. "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the Lord rises upon you. See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the Lord rises upon you and his glory appears over you. Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn... No longer will violence be heard in your land, nor ruin or destruction within your borders, but you will call your walls Salvation and your gates Praise. The sun will no more be your light by day, nor will the brightness of the moon shine on you, for the Lord will be your everlasting light, and your God will be your glory. Your sun will never set again, and your moon will wane no more; the Lord will be your everlasting light, and your days of sorrow will end. Then all your people will be righteous and they will possess the land forever. They are the shoot I have planted, the work of my hands, for the display of my splendor. The least of you will become a thousand, the smallest a mighty nation. I am the Lord; in its time I will do this swiftly." (Is. 60: 11-3, 18-22) NIV.

In the beginning, God spoke and it was so. Here too God has spoken and it will be as he has spoken. Therefore, fear not nor be dismayed because the same God who spoke in Genesis is the same God who speaks here. In Him we trust. In him, we live, and move, and have our being. Praise be to our God of everlasting Light!

To God be all the honor, glory, and praise from now and forevermore. Amen!
