SERMON "Yahweh Shalom, The Lord is Peace" Dr. Carlos Baladez Judges 6:24

"So Gideon built an altar to the LORD there and called it The LORD Is Peace. To this day it stands in Ophrah of the Abiezrites." (NIV)

This is the next to the last name of God that we will study this year. Please keep in mind our foundational text for this year, Daniel 11:32b, "but those who know their God will be strong and will do exploits."

The Name of God for this week is, "The Lord is Peace." The writer of Holy Writ places these words in the mouth of Gideon. But before we delve into this precious name of God we need to set up some background and a foundation leading up to this name.

Recall the line of salvific history. The Lord God delivered his people out from under the strong hand of Pharaoh of Egypt. Not an arrow was shot, nor a spear thrown in this deliverance. The Lord God Almighty took on the armies of Pharaoh himself. After ten attacks, Pharaoh and the Egyptians were brought to their knees and the Israelites were set free to go worship their God and offer him sacrifice. This was a way of recognizing the God who had delivered them proving himself as the one true God.

The Lord equipped Moses to lead his people through the wilderness toward the Promised Land. Moses and Arron his brother, the High Priest, died in the desert and the Lord raised Joshua to usher the Israelites into the Promised Land.

"After the death of Joshua," is where today's narrative begins. Scripture tells us in the second chapter of Joshua, "Joshua son of Nun, the servant of the LORD, died at the age of a hundred and ten. And they buried him in the land of his inheritance, at Timnath Heres in the hill country of Ephraim, north of Mount Gaash. After that whole generation had been gathered to their ancestors, another generation grew up who knew neither the LORD nor what he had done for Israel." (NIV)

What happened as a result of another generation growing up who knew neither the LORD nor what he had done for Israel? The Israelites did evil in the eyes of the LORD and served the Baals. They forsook the LORD, the God of their ancestors, who had brought them out of Egypt. They followed and worshiped various gods of the people around them. They aroused the LORD's anger (WHY?) because they forsook him and served two fertility gods, Baal and Ashtoreth. Hence, a vicious cycle began. They forsook God, thus, they were then forsaken by the LORD, they remembered God and cried to the LORD, then, they were remembered and delivered. (NIV)

These cycles or patterns occur at least five times from Judges Chapter 1 to today's passage. It was in one of these upward cycles that we encounter Gideon in the Book of Judges.

Notice this encounter – When the Israelites cried out to the Lord because of Midian, he sent them a prophet, who said, "This is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says: I brought you up out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. I rescued you from the hand of the Egyptians. And I delivered you from the hand of all your oppressors; I drove them out before you and gave you their land. I said to you, 'I am the Lord your God; do not

worship the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you live.' But you have not listened to me." The angel of the Lord came and sat down under the oak in Ophrah that belonged to Joash the Abiezrite, where his son Gideon was threshing wheat in a winepress to keep it from the Midianites. (NIV)

When the angel of the Lord appeared to Gideon, he said, "The Lord is with you, mighty warrior." "Pardon me, my lord," Gideon replied, "but if the Lord is with us, why has all this happened to us? Where are all his wonders that our ancestors told us about when they said, 'Did not the Lord bring us up out of Egypt?' But now the Lord has abandoned us and given us into the hand of Midian." Do these questions sound familiar? Have you ever heard a believer express the same things? I am sure we all have at one time or another. Or have you ever complained to God in the same manner? (NIV)

The passage continues: The Lord turned to him (Gideon) and said, "Go in the strength you have and save Israel out of Midian's hand. Am I not sending you?" "Pardon me, my lord," Gideon replied, "but how can I save Israel? My clan is the weakest in Manasseh, and I am the least in my family." (NIV) Do you hear echoes of Moses here?

The narration continues, The Lord answered, "I will be with you, and you will strike down all the Midianites, leaving none alive." Gideon replied, "If now I have found favor in your eyes, give me a sign that it is really you talking to me. Please do not go away until I come back and bring my offering and set it before you." And the Lord said, "I will wait until you return." Gideon went inside, prepared a young goat, and from an ephah of flour (which is approximately 42 pounds of flour) he made bread without yeast. Putting the meat in a basket and its broth in a pot, he brought them out and offered them to him under the oak. The angel of God said to him, "Take the meat and the unleavened bread, place them on this rock, and pour out the broth." And Gideon did so. Then the angel of the Lord touched the meat and the unleavened bread with the tip of the staff that was in his hand. Fire flared from the rock, consuming the meat and the bread. And the angel of the Lord disappeared. When Gideon realized that it was the angel of the Lord, he exclaimed, "Alas, Sovereign Lord! I have seen the angel of the Lord face to face!" But the Lord said to him, "Peace! Do not be afraid. You are not going to die." So Gideon built an altar to the Lord there and called it The Lord Is Peace. (NIV)

Gideon was afraid he was going to die when he saw the Lord. Instead, he was assured that he would not die and experienced the Peace of God. God is peace.

Moving forward to today. God is our Peace in Christ Jesus. It is in Jesus that we live and move and have our being. God is not only our peace but also our hope. Remember, when Jesus cries out from the cross, "It is finished!"? In Spanish, this phrase reads, "Consumado es," which literally means "it is consumed." Gideon's sacrifice and the sacrifice of the Lamb of God, Jesus Christ, were both consumed. In our case, the Lamb of God is a sign that in Christ, we have peace with the Lord our God forever.

When is it that experience this peace of God from our enemies? When we believe and experience the love of God for ourselves. This love and the Lord as our Peace is expressed and shared when we love our spouses, when we do not provoke our children to anger or when we do not forsake assembling with other saints to worship God our Creator. Other enemies that flee when we experience God as our peace are depression, anxiety, hate, envy, distress, and the like.

And when we do not have God as our peace, we can experience emptiness, anger, and strife no matter how much money, fame, or fortune we acquire. We are miserable, fearful, and subjugated just like the Israelites in the times of the Judges.

Like the Israelites of old, the moment we cry out to God, he will remind us of the deliverer he has already sent. The name of our deliverer is, JESUS! His name is higher than any other and at his name, every knee shall bow and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord!

What to do now? We remember. We remember and we do not forget all the benefits that the Good Lord has done for us. We remember and hold dear to our hearts and recall with our minds, and express with our mouths what God has done on our behalf as individuals, as families, as a worshiping community, as the sheep of his pasture, as his children, and as his very own people. Let us recall that in Christ Jesus we have seen the Lord and instead of dying, we now live forever. Glory to God. Hallelujah!

To God be all the glory, honor, and praise forevermore. Amen.
